NOTE: The events of Jesus' death are not in order here, but neither are the plagues of Egypt!

The plagues of Egypt left out are #4 Gnats; #5 Flies; #8 Locusts. #1 serpents could be included here, but there may be a subtle illusion to this in the frog coming from the Dragon, which in Rev. 12 is "that ancient serpent." In total, only a little over half of the Egyptian plagues are represented by the final plagues.
